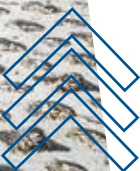

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

WHAT ARE T LEVELS?

T Levels are nationally recognised technical qualifications worth the same number of UCAS points as 3 A Levels. They tend to follow GCSEs, and are a two-year qualification bringing together classroom study and a work placement. Your T Level will help you to step straight into your chosen career, apprenticeship or degree, having gained relevant knowledge and the skills and behaviours sought by employers.

T Levels provide more academic study than Apprenticeships. You will experience a mix of classroom and workplace-based learning, spending 80% of your time at college and 20% of your time developing the skills needed for the workplace.

BACKED BY BUSINESS

A wide range of leading businesses of all sizes and across different industries helped to shape T Levels. They are now supported by employers to give you the workplace skills you need to succeed.

Many employers support progression of T Level students within their business, whether that's moving onto an apprenticeship or starting another role.

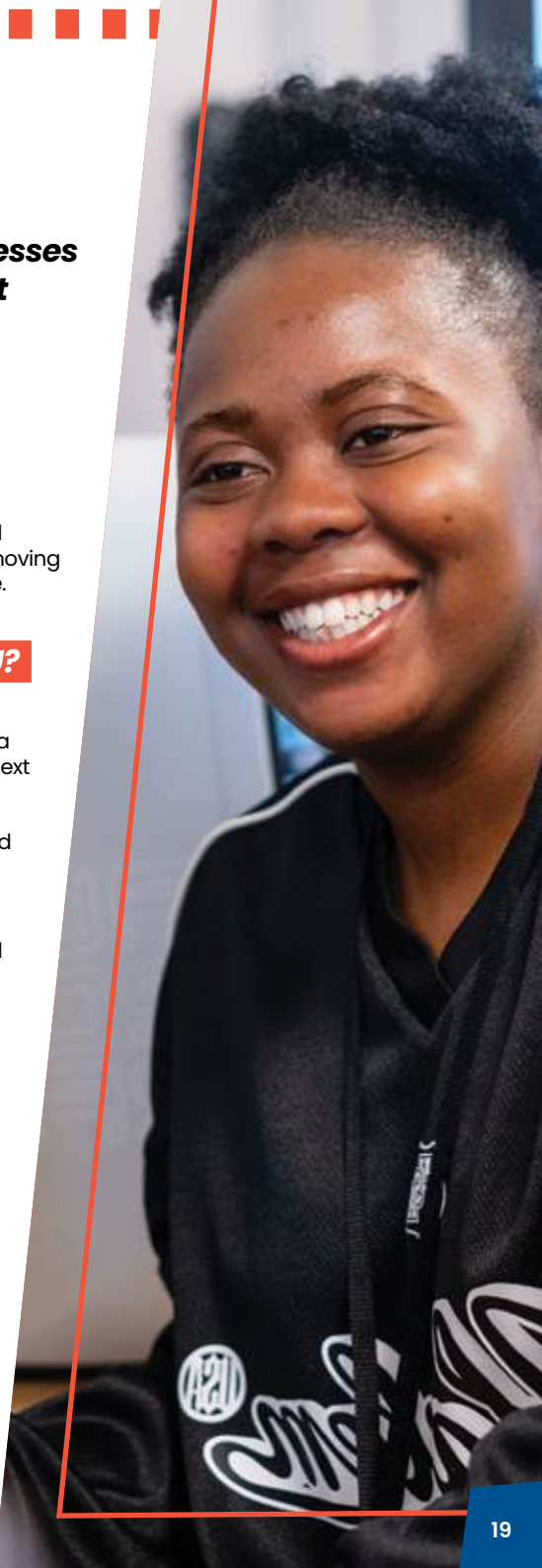
WHERE CAN T LEVELS TAKE YOU?

Combining classroom based learning and workplace experience, T Levels put students in a strong position when it comes to deciding on next steps by:

- Providing a head start on the skills needed for the workplace with an exciting 45 day industrial placement
- Opening doors to skilled employment, HE or an apprenticeship. One T Level has the equivalent of three A Levels, so has the same UCAS points value.

Apprenticeships offer structured training programmes that are designed to develop specific skills and knowledge relevant to the industry. This enables you to acquire a wide range of industry approved skills, from technical expertise to enable success in the field, to invaluable personal and professional skills such as communication, teamwork and time-management.

The Level 1 (Gateway) in Progression is a qualification that includes a broad range of skills, which will support students. The qualification is flexible and variable, and has been designed to progress students into further learning and/or employment.

Core units – these are mandatory and include:

- Self-assessment.

You will choose from a range of vocational areas, including:

- Art and performing arts
- Engineering

- Public services

You will also study/complete:

- Work experience

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Student work will be assessed and verified throughout the year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

This Level 1 qualification has been designed to support students to progress into paid employment. You will spend a large amount of time with your employer while developing practical life skills and gaining valuable work experience.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

This course is for students with special educational needs (who have an EHC Plan) who want to progress into paid employment.

During your internship, you will spend a large amount of time with an employer, gaining work experience, with the aim of giving you a real insight into the world of work.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

Student work will be assessed and verified throughout the year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

- A satisfactory college interview
- Suitable references
- Appropriate level of English and mathematics.

WHAT NEXT?

You could progress onto either supported employment, voluntary work or paid employment.

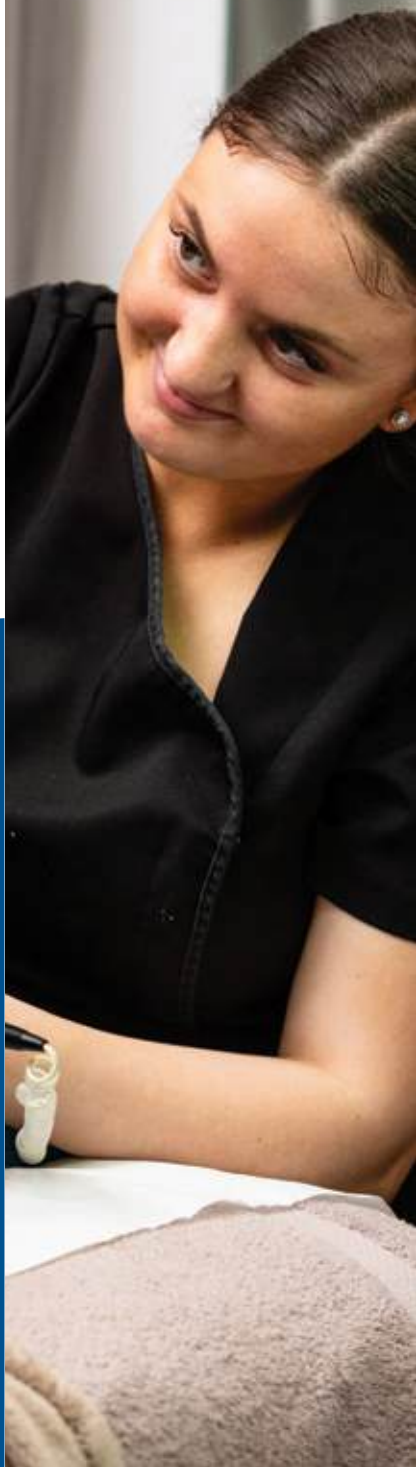

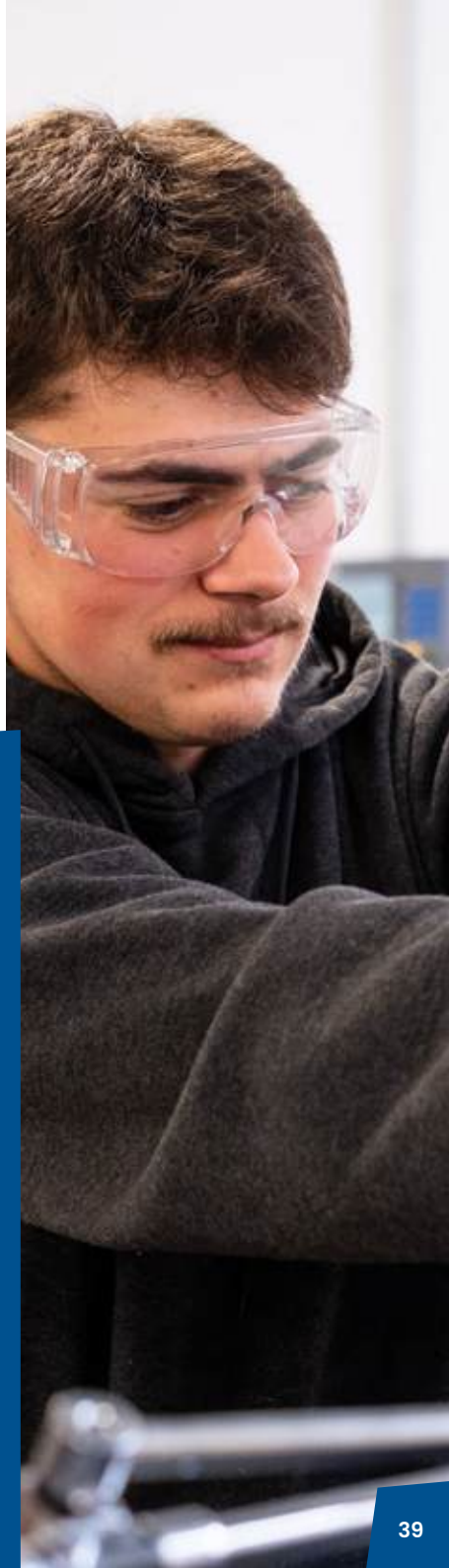

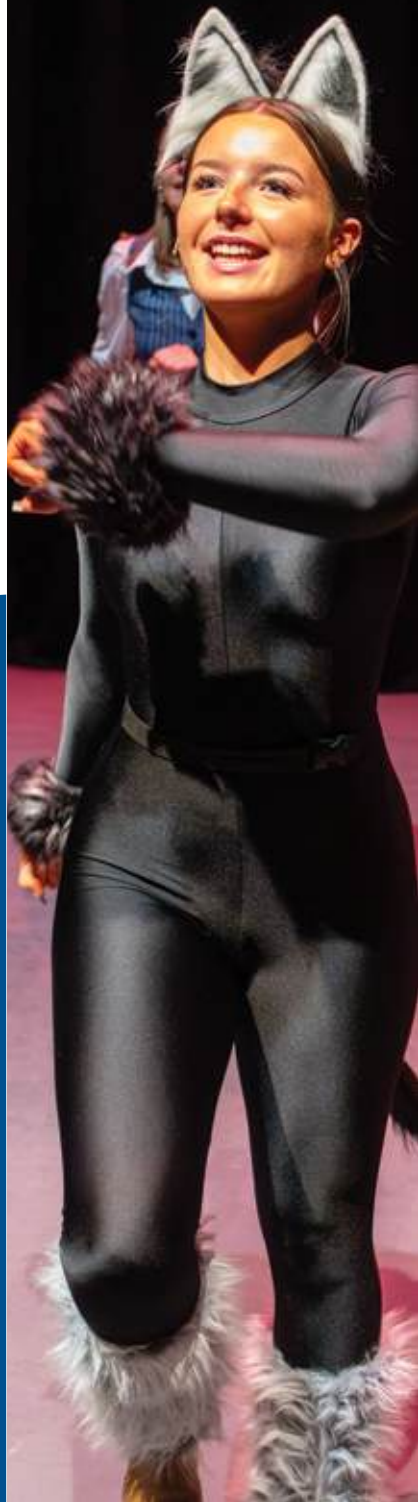

T LEVEL EDUCATION AND EARLY YEARS

BRIDLINGTON & BEVERLEY CAMPUS

The T level in Education and Early Years is a two-year programme which aims to prepare students to gain the knowledge, skills and practical experience necessary to work with young children either in nursery settings, primary school or in various other careers in the sector.

To study on a T level programme, you need to achieve a minimum of four GCSEs at grades 4-9 which must include maths and English language.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

In the first year, you will study the 12 core elements which include:

- Child development
- Working in partnership with parents, carers, agencies and support services
- Equality, diversity and inclusive practice
- Reflective practice
- Special educational needs
- Safeguarding and wellbeing.

In the second year the emphasis will be on the occupational specialism to gain your Early Years Educator which is the industry standard licence to practice at Level 3.

WORK EXPERIENCE:

Students will undertake a minimum of 750 hours practical work placement experience over the duration of the course. This can be in a variety of early years settings and with children between the ages of 0 to 7 years.
