Course Title	Professional Graduate Certificate in Education (Professional Diploma in Teaching – Further Education and Skills)
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1.	Course Details
	To be a student of TEC Partnership based at East Riding College studying the course Certificate in Education (Professional Diploma in Teaching – Further Education and Skills) validated by TEC Partnership. The validation document which describes the programme is published on the TEC Partnership website and is version number V1 You will be required to complete 120 credits which are broken down into six modules, four of 15 credits and two 30 credit modules.

2.	Student Activities
	Delivery will occur twice a week during term time, each time for one full day, totalling 12 hours per week for 30 weeks. These sessions will blend approaches to delivery of theory and practice using a co-creation model of delivery. Trainees will also complete 150 hours of teaching, across two different placements during which time they will be observed at least 10 times. Trainees will spend an additional 100 hours in their placement department engaging in other teacher focussed activities.

3.	Following full engagement in the programme, and upon its successful completion, students will:
	1. Present information to impart knowledge, and apply teaching skills that change behaviours, designing learning in a variety of forms which ensure that all learners build knowledge and can apply it in practice. 2. Recognise the diversity of learners, and apply this when managing a classroom, and provide work that is demanding and builds knowledge and promotes skill development of the learners. 3. Demonstrate the ability to challenge learners to improve their knowledge, skills and behaviours and assess their development,

	identifying misconceptions and providing clear and direct feedback. 4. Reflect on their own value systems, development and practices, using established concepts and theories encountered in their studies and understand the limits of their knowledge in using underpinning theory and research. 5. Communicate both academically and professionally and have a critical understanding of pedagogical, andragogical and theoretical approaches in practice and how they influence professional values and curriculum development. 6. Critically analyse and apply inclusive and ethical principles and safeguarding within the field of post compulsory education. 7. Use educational technology to enhance the teaching and learning experience within classrooms and beyond, and critically analyse its impact on teaching, learning and assessment. 8. Analyse own practice to identify issues, conducting primary or secondary research to find practical solutions and communicate these to different audiences in an appropriate manner.
